## CHRISTIAN OUTREACH

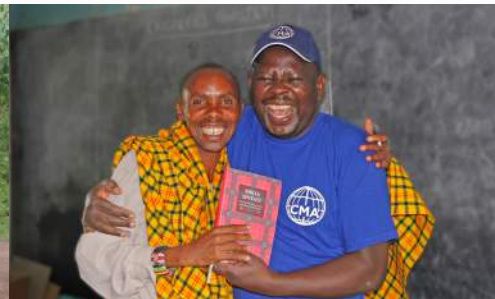


**207 Pastors & Church leaders** in remote parts of Africa trained for works of service among their communities.  
**11 Seminars** conducted.

**58 Deaf Pastors** trained for effective ministry among the deaf people.  
**2 Seminars** conducted.



**21 Bicycles** distributed to pastors to ease their movement as they serve their people.  
**2 Motor bikes** were given out for service in harsh terrain.



**882 Bibles** provided to CMA trained rural pastors and their congregations. This has helped to initiate more than **254 Bible study groups**.



**3,769 church members** actively involved in small group Bible study in their homes.

**3 Audio Bibles** given so that illiterate people can listen to God's word in their own language for spiritual growth.



## CHILDREN & YOUTH



**860** People provided with food in our food buckets campaign.

**3** young people sponsored for college education.

**712** girls from poor and vulnerable communities trained on personal hygiene and sanitary kits distributed through the Smart Girl Initiative.



**3,000**

Children & youth reached with God's word and mentored through well structured programs, provision of biblical resources and skills.

**30,000**

Children's Bible study materials distributed with inspiring Bible stories.



**192** Christian Religious Education

Teachers trained through the God's Word Every Child (GWEC) Training program.

**250** attended Youth Camp where the youth were able to interact, and learn God's word together.

**24** Youth Camp Counselors trained on how to effectively lead small groups and basic counseling skills during youth camps.

**431** Children reached through Vacation Bible School.

**1,000** Children & youth reached through sports camps.

**150** refugees and needy children fully sponsored to school and 13 teachers paid.

**20** desks and chairs presented and **35** students registered for KCSE exams.

## COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

**Dairy Project at Girls Rescue Center (GRC)**



GRC now has **19 pure bred dairy cows** producing enough milk for the center's consumption and a surplus for sale, providing an income for the center.

**13** NEW GIRLS RESCUED

from Harmful Traditional Practices like sexual abuse, female genital mutilation and forced early marriage. 5 girls sat for secondary school final exams and 2 others finished their college education.

**90** girls have been rescued so far.

**6** School teams participated in sports activities as part of sports evangelism.



**600** School children provided with water tank for clean drinking water



**42** Maasai adults receive basic literacy

Women with good literacy skills are more likely to have higher self-esteem, better health, better jobs and higher wages than those with poor literacy skills.

**2** Goats provided to HIV/AIDS widows in Nyanza. "The beauty of this gift of goats is that they will keep giving more and more. We will get milk, manure and to top it off, young ones which we can bless other widows," said a happy Maseline Auma on behalf of the widows.

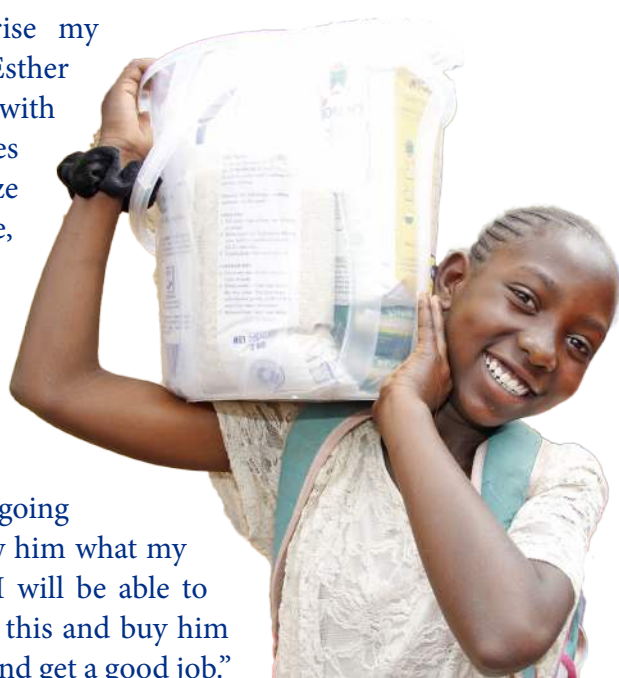
## Thank You for BUCKETS OF JOY

"I can't wait to surprise my dad," said an elated Esther when we presented her with a bucketful of supplies that included maize flour, wheat flour, rice, green grams, cooking oil, salt and beans. "He struggles so much to have some food on the table for us. He at times wonders if I should join him in work instead of going to school but I will show him what my education can achieve. I will be able to bring him food just like this and buy him things when I graduate and get a good job."

Esther has lived with her father since she was one year old after her mother abandoned them. The father is a casual laborer who earns so little just to survive. They share one room within the Gataka slum.

This family was one of the 860 families that benefited from your generosity in providing food during the Christmas season.
