The Christian **Outreach ministry** is the foundation of Christian Mission Aid. CMA provides leadership trainings and equips local pastors and church leaders from least-reached. underdeveloped areas with knowledge and skills for effective ministry. The pastors are also provided with Bibles, and given mobility through bicycles and motorcycles.

# **Children & Youth**

The Children and **Youth Ministry** conducts innovative ministries geared towards mentoring and empowering children and youth, showing them the love of Christ and equipping them to become world changers and history makers of their generation, CMA offers these children a chance to achieve their dreams, giving them hope of a better life.



### **The Girls Rescue Center Highlights**

Presently, there are 49 girls resident at the Girls' Rescue Center. 10 girls graduated after going through high school with most of them qualifying for college education. Sheila, (pictured below receiving an award) was among the finalists in the primary school education who will be proceeding to high school.

# **Community Development**

Community Development Ministry: CMA promotes communitydriven approach that empowers leaders to use their Godgiven abilities to create sustainable development in their own communities to successfully overcome their needs and challenges.



**Water filters:** clean drinking water is a major challenge to people in marginalized communities, causing water-borne diseases. CMA distributed water filters as a solution to this perennial problem.

### **Orisai Irrigation Project:** Food security for the community

The **22 acre** irrigation project draws water from a nearby lake to irrigate onions, corn, amaranth and eggplant to feed the community, among them 350 students from the local primary school. **36,230 Kgs** of onions **48,000 kgs** of maize were harvested.

The project has been so successful that the local Government officials have visited the site for benchmarking to replicate the model in other areas.



Aid & Relief Ministry: CMA provides quick and appropriate emergency relief and care to victims of natural and man-made disasters reaching many families that lack basic needs in Kenya and Uganda, and providing emergency medical and nutritional services in war-torn South Sudan. CMA is a leading organization in nutrition and medical interventions in South Sudan.
