Christian Outreach:

This is the heart of CMA. Pastors and church leaders in remote, under-served regions are empowered through leadership training and equipped for effective ministry. Additionally, they receive Bibles and mobility

tools such as bicycles and motorcycles to enhance their outreach effectiveness.









125 Pastors & Church leaders trained

Thousands of people were reached with the Gospel of Jesus Christ through the Jesus **Film ministry**

505 Bibles & 25 Audio Bibles and 1,200 **4-Spiritual Laws distributed to pastors &** churches.

30 Pastors and **44** Government officials from the warring tribes of Pokot and Marakwet trained on Peace and Conflict Resolution.

Committees of Peace-makers from both tribes were formed for exerted efforts toward lasting peace.

19 Deaf Pastors Graduated & a new cohort of **23** more leaders started training.

Leadership Training for Deaf Pastors: Kenya's estimated 1.3 million deaf individuals often face marginalization, illiteracy and lack of access to the Gospel and essential information. CMA's Deaf Ministry addresses this by equipping and providing access to the Gospel and empowering deaf adults and youth with life skills.

20 Motorcycles and **18** bicycles provided to rural pastors to enhance their ministry.

Pastors from rural areas face major challenges. traveling long distances on foot in harsh terrain and under the hot sun. Addressing this need greatly enhances their ministries.

Children & Youth

employs dynamic programs to mentor and empower young people, demonstrating Christ's love and preparing them to be time opportunities to pursue their dreams. CMA instills hope

The Girls' Rescue Center:

60 girls presently residing at the Center 10 more girls were rescued this year 6 girls graduated from high school 22 girls getting a college education

The Center is a safe haven for girls rescued from FGM and forced-early marriage, providing them with their personal needs, counseling, medical care and an education. The Farm and the dairy provide balanced meals for the girls.

"God's Word Every Child" (GWEC)

157 teachers trained and equipped to teach Bible stories to children in a fun and exciting way

18,000 booklets distributed to students & children attending Sunday school

The SmartGirl/Boy Initiative:

Over **379** school girls were provided with self-confidence, reproductive and hygiene education and given sanitary kits

178 boys mentored on peer pressure, drug abuse, health/hygiene, and relationships, all based on Christian principles

Education Sponsorships:

107 students given the opportunity of an education in hope of a better future.

CMA, in partnership with SUNRAY Fund, offers education opportunities to South Sudanese refugee students who have fled their war-torn country.

Community DevelopmentMinistry promotes a community-led strategy, empowering local leaders to use available resources for sustainable growth by meeting community needs and overcoming challenges through self-driven initiatives.

Water filters are an effective solution for providing clean drinking water and reducing water-borne diseases in marginalized communities. CMA ensures successful implementation through training on filter use, hygiene & sanitation education. Over 3,100 water filter kits were distributed to families in Maasailand and urban slums.

Adult Literacy Program:

6 new adult classes initiated this year, resulting in a total of **260** ADULTS attending literacy classes.

So many Maasai women yearn for empowerment through education to become better at managing small businesses, read their Bibles and engage with their children's school work.

Widows ministry in Nyanza: CMA has reached out to hundreds of widows living with HIV, providing them with food, counseling, medical care and education for their children.

School Desks Program:

CMA in partnership with Saruni International provided over **400** desks, **20** shelves and **10** tables to schools in Kajiado County. This provision has made students more comfortable and able to focus better on their studies.









Aid & relief CMA delivers rapid, life-saving assistance to families devastated by disasters in Kenya and Uganda. In war-torn South Sudan, CMA's impact is profound, delivering vital nutrition and medical interventions that directly combat the devastating consequences of conflict and instability, saving lives and building resilience within vulnerable communities.









Nutritious food reached **thousands** of struggling families in slums and hardship areas through CMA's life-saving emergency relief program.

19,729 Children under 5 years treated for malnutrition

27,911 Children vaccinated for protection against vaccine-preventable diseases

9,155 Pregnant and lactating women admitted and treated of malnutrition

12,391 Mothers received Ante-Natal Care services

3,109 Deliveries in Ayod health facilities assisted by skilled birth attendants

22 Health Facilities renovated, **9** Pit latrines constructed

42,270 Children received Vitamin A supplementation and de-worming.

21,222 mothers received nutrition education

143,601 People reached with Health Care Services

114 workers trained on community programs and management of common diseases

1,600 mosquito nets distributed
